ORDINANCE NO. 2018-1

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROARING SPRING
REGULATING THE PARKING OF ANY MOTORIZED
VEHICLES ON BOROUGH STREETS AND HIGHWAYS DURING
DECLARED SNOW EMERGENCIES AND OTHER SNOW SITUATIONS**

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Roaring Spring, Blair County, Pennsylvania, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania that:

Section One. This Ordinance shall be named the “Roaring Spring Snow Ordinance”.

Section Two. As referenced in this Ordinance, a “Snow Emergency” shall occur when the Mayor, Chief of Police or, in their absence, the Emergency Management Coordinator declares a Snow Emergency.

A Snow Emergency Declaration will be made following an accumulation of four or more inches of snow or when other significant winter weather events cause a disruption and impede normal traffic patterns.

Section Three. When a Snow Emergency Declaration has been made, the following streets and highways will receive priority for plowing, treatment and cleaning curb to curb:

1. Main Street from the Borough line to Bloomfield Street.
2. Spang Street from Main Street to State Route 36.
3. East Main Street from Main Street to State Route 36.
4. Robinson Avenue from Main Street to State Route 36.

During the time a Snow Emergency Declaration is in effect, there shall be no parking on snow emergency routes until such time as the Declaration has been lifted by the Mayor, Chief of Police or in their absence, the Emergency Management Coordinator.

Section Four. All Streets designated as Snow Emergency Routes shall be posted with signs indicating that they are “Snow Emergency Routes”.

Section Five. The Borough shall have the right to post any Borough street which is not a Snow Emergency Route for curb to curb plowing and clearing in order to maintain the orderly flow of traffic and/or to enhance the safe and free movement of larger vehicles including but not limited to fire apparatus, ambulances and local delivery trucks. Notice of the need to

remove vehicles from a street scheduled for plowing and clearing shall be made in any way reasonably calculated to reach impacted members of the public, but at the very least, shall include posted notices along the street to be cleared.

Section Six. Any vehicle located on a street in violation of this Ordinance will be towed at the direction of the Roaring Spring Borough Police Department and the owner of said vehicle shall pay all costs associated with the towing.

Section Seven. Any violation of this Ordinance shall constitute a summary offense and the owner of the vehicle violating this Ordinance shall be subject to a fine of no less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00). Each day in violation of this Ordinance shall be considered a separate violation.


Section Eight. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held void or unconstitutional, all other sections and all other provisions of this Ordinance which are not so held void or unconstitutional shall continue in full force and effect.

Section Nine. This Ordinance shall repeal any other Ordinance which is inconsistent with the provisions contained herein.


Section Ten. This Ordinance shall be in effect from the date of its enactment.


