

ORDINANCE NO. 1982-8

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ROARING SPRING DEFINING DISORDERLY CONDUCT AND SETTING FOR TH THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 45

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by Council of the Borough of Roaring Spring, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful and it shall constitute disorderly conduct for any person to do any of the following as set forth in Paragraphs 1 through 8:

1. To breach the peace, to wander about the streets or alleys or public places of said Borough with no legitimate purpose or business, to engage in fighting, to incite or promote others to fight, to engage in any act so as to threaten a person or to threaten or to endanger or injure the property of another within the Borough.

2. To use loud, boisterous, profane, blasphemous, indecent or immoral language upon or near any of the public streets or public places of the Borough or to make loud, boisterous, profane, blasphemous, indecent or immoral language in a manner so as to annoy residents in the neighborhood or in the Borough or to make any unnecessary noise or disturbance of any kind in the Borough so as to annoy the residents nearby or to annoy the police or public officials who may observe the same.

3. To commit any act of lewdness or public indecency or to become intoxicated or to become under the influence of any drug or other similar substance.

4. To loaf, loiter or stand upon any of the sidewalks, public streets or public places of the Borough after oral direction to disperse by any police officer or public official is given.

5. To set up, maintain, or conduct any gambling place or device, immoral show or entertainment or exhibition; unlawful drinking place, resort or house of prostitution, or to conduct any disorderly house where children under the age of eighteen years are allowed to gather in violation of the law as to drinking, drug use or any other violation of the law, or where individuals under the age of twenty-one years are permitted to drink intoxicants, or take any unlicensed drug in violation of the law or to be a patron thereof.

6. To carry any concealed deadly weapon unless authorized by law or to discharge any gun or firearm, unless said discharge is in defense of person or property; or to throw on or into any street or highway any stones, snowballs or other material of any kind or to raise any false alarm of fire or false alarm as to any other type of catastrophe.

7. To throw on or into any street or highway in the Borough, snow, ice, leaves or other debris of any kind.

8. To interfere with the Borough police officers or other Borough public officials in carrying out their duties to resist arrest, or to tamper with, destroy or otherwise interfere with any lights, guard rails, signs or other public property or materials placed in public places by the Borough or any of its officials.

Section 2. Any person or persons or partnership or corporation or any other entity violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a summary offense and shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$300.00 and/or imprisonment not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 3. Should any section or paragraph or portion of this Ordinance be declared illegal or unconstitutional, said finding shall in no way impair the validity and enforcement of all other provisions and sections of this Ordinance.

Section 4. Ordinance No. 45 enacted November 3, 1952 is hereby repealed.
